MODULE AIMS

This module aims to:

- 1. enhance students' ability to communicate in an academic English speaking environment
- 2. extend students' active vocabulary use
- 3. revise and consolidate ability to use grammar effectively
- 4. develop the skills necessary for independent language learning

MODULE **CONTENT**

Students will develop productive (speaking and writing) and receptive skills (reading and listening) so as to be able to function effectively in an English speaking academic environment. Grammar consolidation and vocabulary extension appropriate to moving on from B1 to B2 (CEFR) level are also included to enhance accuracy.

Students will also be encouraged to become independent language learners.

On successful completion of this module a student will be able to:

1.	Demonstrate the ability to take an active role in spoken interaction and express themselves effectively, using appropriate register, relevant to B1-B2 level*.		
2.	Demonstrate the ability to express themselves effectively in a range of written texts, using appropriate register, relevant to B1-B2 level*.		
3.	Comprehend spoken English, relevant to B1- B2 level*.		
4.	Comprehend written texts, relevant to B1-B2 level*.		
5.	Demonstrate the ability to effectively use B1-B2 level* grammar and vocabulary.
