Introduction by the Head and Deputy Head, **Professor Stéphanie Laulhé Shaelou,** **Dr Klearchos A. Kyriakides**



Since its establishment in 2012, UCLan Cyprus has prided itself on offering students a rich, rigorous and rounded education. In this spirit, the School of Law has cultivated a distinctive ethos infused with intellectual inquiry, critical thinking, reasoned analysis, robust Socratic dialogue, ethics, commercial awareness and exposure to the gritty realities of life.

In keeping with the traditions of academia, the mission of the School of Law has been to provide first class teaching, research and various forms of public engagement.

Teaching has revolved around the traditional English LLB Degree and a more internationally-flavoured LLM Degree.

Research has enabled postgraduate research students and academic staff to

engage in deep, meaningful and serious scholarship.

As for Public engagement, this has not only encompassed the delivery of continuing professional development courses for members of the legal profession, the business community and the public sector. It has also involved the organisation of public lectures, workshops and other events aimed at members of the general public.

As such, the School of Law has constituted a multi-dimensional centre of learning, which has exposed its students and external stakeholders to a blend of academic theory, legal practice and an awareness of how law inter-links with other fields of endeavour. For students, this educational approach has helped to prepare them for life beyond the walls of academia. In fulfilment of its mission, the School of Law has always striven to supplement the formal syllabus with an array of co-curricular, extra-curricular and other events involving guest speakers from the judiciary, the legal profession, academia, business and beyond.

In parallel, the School of Law has regularly organised field trips or facilitated other external visits which have enabled students to travel to historic sites, to mix with members of the legal profession or to come into contact with other prospective employers. During the 2019-20 academic year, such visits included one to the Auschwitz-Birkenau Concentration Camp and Museum in Poland. This was led by Dr Natalie Alkiviadou, Lecturer, UCLan Cyprus School of Law.

Since 2012, the School of Law has gone the extra mile to reach out to judges, lawyers and academics beyond the Republic of Cyprus. During the first few months of the 2019/20 academic year, this ongoing effort resulted in the

presence in the School of Law of Amy Grant, an experienced attorney from Oregon in the United States of America and an expert in Information Technology Law. Amy joined the School of Law as a Fulbright Scholar and as a Senior Visiting Fellow. In these capacities, she enriched the education of students. She also passed on her knowledge to members of the legal profession, compliance officers, academics and others who underwent Continuing Professional Development (CPD) under her astute guidance. She did so primarily via a series of three CPD courses co-delivered by Amy and held at the Cleopatra Hotel in Nicosia.

During the 2019-20 academic year, the international ties of the UCLan Cyprus School of Law were highlighted by other events held on campus. Examples include the events co-organised by School with the High Commission of India in Cyprus, the Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands in Cyprus and the International Criminal Court in The Hague, as well as the British High Commission in Cyprus and the Embassy of Ukraine in Cyprus.

As illustrated by the list of events in this Annual Review, the 2019-2020 academic year followed a traditional pattern involving one gathering after another until the pattern came to a screeching halt when the World Health Organisation declared a pandemic on Wednesday 11 March 2020. Two days later, on Friday 13 March 2020, the Director-General of the World Health Organisation disclosed that, due to the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19), 'Europe has now become the epicenter of the pandemic, with more reported cases and deaths than the rest of the world combined, apart from China.' On that very same fateful date, the President of the Republic of Cyprus announced the imposition of strict new

measures which amounted to what has come to be known as 'a lockdown'.

In the interests of public health and the safety of each individual student and other person associated with it, UCLan Cyprus triggered a number of inter-linked developments. These included the temporary termination of traditional face-to-face teaching, an immediate switch-over to online tuition and the prohibition of gatherings on as well as off the campus of UCLan Cyprus. Among other consequences, online classes began on Monday 16 March 2020 and various events, including the Annual Dinner and Lecture scheduled to take place on 20 March 2020, were aborted or postponed. That being said, as illustrated by the Annual Review, a number of the postponed events were rescheduled at later dates.

While ensuring that UCLan Cyprus was able to comply with its legal obligations, these measures helped the Republic of Cyprus to avoid the pandemic-related catastrophes which befell certain other parts of Europe. Yet, these measures also enabled the academic year to continue via Blackboard, the e-learn environment operated by UCLan in the UK and UCLan Cyprus, the existing online information platforms available via the website of the UCLan Cyprus Library and Microsoft Teams, an electronic platform which use was enhanced for learning and working purposes.

During the protracted lockdown, these platforms enabled academics to continue to communicate with students electronically – via online lectures, seminars, workshops, group gatherings and one-to-one meetings. Most importantly, they permitted all students, including final year undergraduates, to complete their studies, albeit subject to modified examination arrangements

and, in some cases, modified coursework procedures in full alignment with quality assurance in Cyprus and the UK, as well as professional body requirements in England and Wales.

During the lockdown, the School of Law likewise managed to help the legal profession and the wider community. It did so by organising or delivering a number of online webinars and other events. Furthermore, the School of Law established the online Rule of Law Monitoring Mechanism – at <https://law-blog.uclancyprus.ac.cy/rolmm/> – as an online method of helping to keep an eye on the rule of law, the proper administration of justice, human dignity and fundamental freedoms as well as rights. Multiple blogs on the subject-matter were published during the period of April to July 2020.

The School of Law expresses its condolences to all families who have lost loved ones as a result of coronavirus (COVID-19). At the same time, the School of Law thanks every academic, every other member of staff across UCLan Cyprus and every student for their co-operation – as well as collegiality – during the 2019/2020 academic year. Amid the pandemic, the ability to operate effectively was very much the outcome of a collective effort in which each individual played a vital role.

In this context, it is appropriate to add further expressions of thanks.

The School of Law is truly grateful to all persons – be they healthcare professionals, social care professionals, cleaning staff, supermarket staff or otherwise. They have worked tirelessly in support of their fellow human beings amid exceptionally trying circumstances during the pandemic.

Thank you.

The School of Law is similarly grateful to every guest speaker, attendee, other participant, host, sponsor and everybody else associated with its multiple face-to-face and online events during this extraordinary academic year. Details on these events are in the pages which follow.

Let us hope that the pandemic will shortly subside.



COURSE OUTLINE

Anti-Money Laundering and Counter Terrorist Financing (AML/CTF) compliance is increasingly becoming an integrated part of the international financial service industry and the legal profession. Designed from financial businesses and professions (FIFPs), such as those relating to accountants, lawyers, bankers and financial service providers, are ever more expected to be involved in AML/CTF compliance laws, procedures and regulatory frameworks and practices. Any failure to comply with the relevant laws, principles and procedures, may result in civil proceedings, criminal proceedings, disciplinary proceedings or a combination of the three.

For these reasons, the Law School of UCLan Cyprus is offering a course aimed at providing advanced students with a broad knowledge and understanding of AML/CTF compliance fundamentals and principles.

The Course will also provide participants with:




