## RESEARCH INTERNSHIP SCHEME 2021-2022

The School of Law invites research-inspired students to apply for the research internship scheme 2021-22, which aims to offer **law students** and **alumni** the opportunity to work (on a part-time or full-time basis) on research initiatives under the supervision of academic staff of the School of Law in partnership with ICLAIM. ### THERE ARE TWO SCHEMES:

- In parallel to study, and on a part time basis (across the academic year)
- On a full-time basis, ranging from 4-12 weeks (normally between May-July)

Upon completion of their internship, interns will receive a Certificate of Achievement and depending on the project, a small stipend towards their travel expenses (if any).

### HOW TO APPLY:

To register, please email your CV accompanied by a cover letter which clearly indicates your research interests and relevant background as well as the special skills and qualities you can bring to the research team.

**Possible themes to be covered** during the research internship scheme include:

1. Research on post-violence and frozen conflict societies
2. Research on reforming the Cyprus Court System (intern should be able to do research in Greek)
3. Research on violence
4. Research on migration
5. Research on international criminal law and armed conflict situations
6. Research on equality, diversity and inclusion. Interns with data analysis skills will be preferred. Internships will take place across the academic year. Deadline for application is 17<sup>th</sup> January 2022.
